The play is a farcical dark comedy based on a classic script that was made into a movie in 1944, directed by Frank Capra. The movie starred Cary Grant and Raymond Massey. The story revolves around two old spinster sisters (Abby and Martha Brewster) who have turned the family home into a boarding house for elderly gentlemen.

peaceful end by poisoning them with homemade elderberry wine. Their nephew Teddy Brewster, who thinks he is President Theodore Roosevelt, is digging the Panama Canal in their basement and he buries the old men there thinking they are victims of the yellow fever epidemic.

Another nephew, Mortimer Brewster, is a drama critic for the local paper and when he discovers the aunt's pastime, he does everything he can to protect them from the law. Meanwhile, a third nephew who is also a psychopath, Jonathan Brewster (who looks very much like Boris Karloff), shows up trying to hide from the authorities who are hot on his trail. The laughs are compounded by the relationship between Mortimer Brewster and his fiancée, Elaine Harper, who just happens to be the daughter of the Presbyterian minister who lives next door to the Brewster home.

then casually walking out with a bag of cash.

Following the robbery, she allegedly walked to a nearby carwash and fled in a car driven by a man who has been identified but has not been arrested.

Presented with the evidence, Jennifer Moore has been cooperative, Lewis said.

According to Lewis, she borrowed the semi-auto-

matic handgun she used in the robbery.

Jennifer Moore reportedly has three children, ages 17, 15 and 9, and she recently had financial problems. It was not stated what her motive was for allegedly robbing the bank.

Richards said police received many tips, including several who called and said they thought they knew her.
