

Panthers CC going to regional meet; girl's second, boy's in third

SPRING HILL – For another first in Bullard athletics history, both Bullard Cross Country teams qualified girl's and boy's teams for the Region III meet in Humble on Nov. 7.

For the second year, the Lady Panthers took second-place behind the Lady Panthers of Spring Hill.

The boy's in third made the big surprise in the boy's division finishing ahead of Chapel Hill for the final regional spot.

Running on a course already to their familiarity, the girl's made a repeat performance finishing behind the hosts, Spring Hill.

Much like the girl's, the boys team was improving every week, and earned a school's first-ever, double-dip trip to the regionals.

Bailee Callens and Kylee Nichols finished third and fourth, while Samantha Phillips and Sarah-Grace French took

eighth and 10th-place for top-ten medals.

Outstanding performances by Rachel Horton in 12th-place and Katy Shumate in 14th-place sewed-up the runner-up spot to the stout Spring Hill team.

Spring Hill dominated with five runners among the top seven as Amber Moore and Leslie Bevins took the top two medalist spots.

The boy's team was consistent throughout the final listings with Donald 'Animal' Sulser taking eighth-place and Keaton Boyd in 15th-place. The duo have been among the top of their division each week, with Boyd making vast improvements throughout the season in a sport he used to get ready for track and baseball.

Showing even more improvement for the boy's were the efforts of Christopher Braaten (17th), David Heithoff (18th), Josh Whatley (20th), Cullen Hippler (25th), and Blayne Noble with a 29th-place finish to put all Panthers in the top-thirty and the third-place regional bid.

Spring Hill claimed five runners in the top-seven, led by top-medalist, Trip Dishman with a 15:57.

Bullard won the girl's JV competition, as Emily Voyles took first-place with a time of 15:59, followed by Devin Soto in fifth-place, clocking in at 16:43.

Heather Anding placed 13th (19:23), Linden Lee won 11th-place (18:36), and Shelby Hall placed 12th, (18:46), for the title finish.

Baker to Chappelle throws Shelton district loss

BULLARD - The table is set for this Friday night in Dallas as the No. 2 ranked, Brook Hill Guard and the No. 4 ranked Dallas Lutheran Lions square off at SMU's Ford Stadium this Friday night.

The Guard (7-1;4-0) man-handled a playoff bound, Dallas-The Shelton School 40-7, on Friday Night.

Once again, The Guard offense need not wear anybody out with all the points they needed at halftime, the roster got another clean-up job surrendering a third quarter Shelton score

A fast-break Guard offense ran away with the contest led by junior quarterback, Tyler Baker throwing for 329 yards and five touchdowns at Herrington Field.

Jeremy Chappelle was on the end of three of the scoring throws, finishing with seven catches for 180 yards. TD grabs of 55-, 44- and 34-yards.

But it was Baker that was cookin' Baker, a junior, completed 16-of-19 passes while the sophomore wr/qb/rb, J.B. Moss was 5-of-9 for 59 yards throwing and another 42 running the ball.

Moss also grabbed three catches for 17 yards and kicked four extra-points.

Making key grabs for Brook Hill were Zac Cool with two catches for 53 yards and another qb/wr, Travis Pirtle came in to make three catches for 32 yards

The Linebacking duo of Tallen Harris and A.J. Minter continues to reek havoc for the Brook Hill defense. Minter had eight tackles, including three for loss while Harris was in on seven tackles and made one fumble recovery. Zac Coll also had an interception.

LOOKING AHEAD

Dallas Lutheran (6-2; 3-0) beat Garland Christian 54-18, last Friday night in a game still missing a key Lions running back component for the second week. The Lions are the first true threat the Guard has faced in the past four seasons, and this game could feature a state champion. The Lions lost to TAPPS large schools Arlington Pantego (18-20), and Houston Lutheran-North (22-31). Lutheran has rolled up the points in wins over Houston Lutheran-South (48-35), a thriller over Scurry-Rosser (22-19), Frisco Legacy Christian (35-22), All Saints 42-14. Lutheran bested Flower Mound-Coram Deo, 27-6 and last week's Garland Christian win with 81 points in the last two

games without their big fullback, Klembra in the Lutheran backfield.

FORT WORTH – The Brook Hill Lady Guard volleyball season came to an end losing in a bi-district battle in five games to Fort Worth-Lake Country, 3-2 on Saturday at Lake Country's gymnasium.

The TAPPS first-round match-up was a nail-biter with Brook Hill winning games one and four (25-17, 25-23), and Lake Country winning games two and three (17-25, 21-25) to set up a back-and-forth final game five 11-15 win for Lake Country.

Leading the way for The Lady Guard in their final games as the lone seniors on the team were, Erica Eden

with six kills, and 30 assist while classmate, Sarah Mullicane added five kills, and two solo blocks.

Also adding to the final totals were Mary Caroline Selden with eight kills, 15 digs, and one block, Amy Jo Teague added 11 kills and 10 digs, while Carley Howard chipped in with 18 digs.

Two freshmen that will be heard from for years to come were Baylee Rozell adding 11kills, eight digs, and two solo blocks, and Alyssa Eden made two kills and two solo blocks.

The Lady Guard finishes another playoff season with a record of 13-18 overall and 7-6 in district play.
